Description of the community need/condition the program strives to resolve

The populations of St. Croix and Pierce Counties populations all live in a relatively high cost-of-living situation when it comes to housing. On average, the cost of living for impoverished families take up to 1/3 of their median income. The job market in this area also tends to oscillate due to the proximity to the Twin Cities, as well as the influx of commuters that live in this area, but work across the river. This creates a self-sustaining system of struggle that makes it harder and harder for families to climb out of poverty, as the cost of living just continues to go up, and the job market remains unstable.

How does the program address the situation and the anticipated positive changes in community conditions.

Habitat works to alleviate this burden with 1-2 builds per year for our selected Partner Families, based on the criteria set by Habitat International. We do this through donations and volunteers who generously put their time and money into building a support network for our Partner Families. They then put in the "sweat-equity" hours we require of them in our criteria selection, along with mandatory training, and then begin the Build and finish it as quickly as allowable. We then hold their zero-interest mortgages for them, until they are able to take over them, and of course we then continue our mission to serve more individuals in need.

Our target population includes low-income individuals and families in St. Croix and Pierce counties, as deemed appropriate by the criteria set by Habitat International.

Collaboration

We partner with the River Falls Housing Authority, Our Neighbor's Place, WestCAP and other county social services to find project candidates. Additionally, we have collaborated with Our Neighbor's Place, Grace Place (Salvation Army) and Turning Point to complete repair projects at their facilities.

We gather our funds from a variety of donors, so we can anticipate the budget that is needed for construction. We do our best to ensure to keep costs to a minimum and we rely on our volunteers to be the backbone that allows our work to continue to grow. We ask for donated labor and materials whenever possible. Without appropriate funding, we are limited to the cost of building materials and the timeline of the construction of the home. Funding is crucial to the beginning and completion of the home for our selected family.
